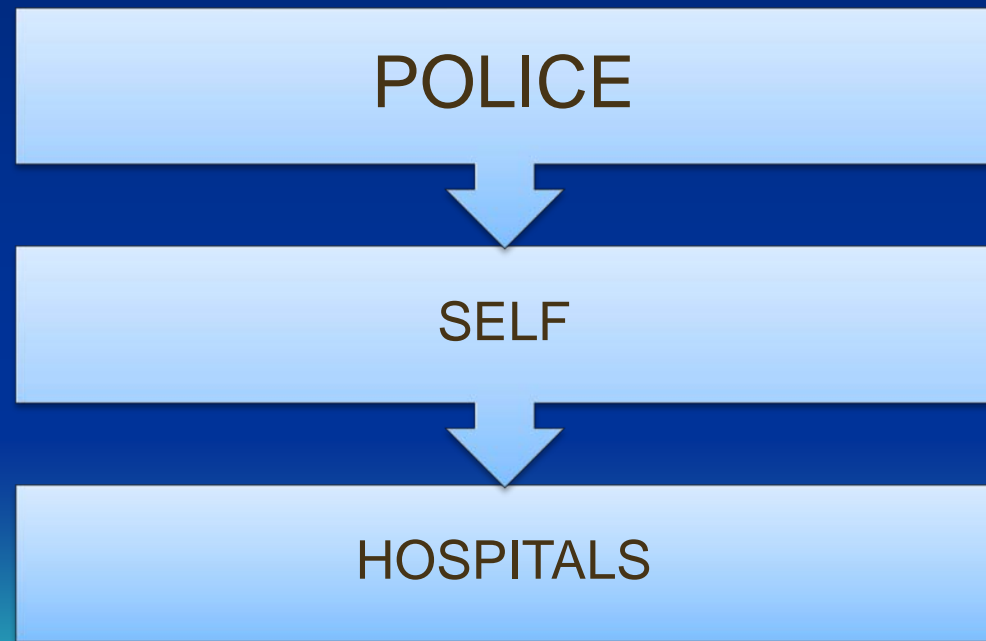


Central Assessment Provides full chemical dependency assessments. It is a voluntary program, and each client is given a referral based on their determined Level of Care. Levels of Care are determined by a person's AoD (Alcohol or Drug) use history. History could be anywhere from years ago to just this morning, so there is not a specific requirement of last use to be referred. No appointment is necessary as Central Assessment accepts walk-ins Monday through Friday from 7:45 am to 1:45 pm. An average time for an assessment is 2 (two) hours. Clients can also be referred by courts (DUI clients for example), Probation/Parole Officers, or other correctional programs as well as other AoD agencies.

# DROP-IN

Drop-In is a place for people to “sleep it off,” so to speak. It’s a place for those that are intoxicated to come in and be provided a safe place to allow the effects of drugs and/or alcohol to wear off. Averaging at least 20 clients a night, we are seeing a rise in those clients that struggle with AoD use AND are homeless. Often times clients are dropped off by the police and is used in lieu of giving someone a “public intoxication” charge.

# DETOX

We offer a sub-acute Detoxification facility. We do medicate, however we are not a Suboxone or Methadone clinic. These medications have shown to have just as bad a withdrawal as any other drug...for some, it's worse. The average length of stay in Detox is anywhere between 3 and 5 days.

We are not like what you see in the movies. Our Detox facility is 100% voluntary. Clients can leave anytime they want, as our doors are always open.

The majority of our clients are "reaching out" as they have hit a low place, commonly referred to as "rock bottom".

# Interval Brotherhood Home

Interval Brotherhood Home is a residential treatment facility that we often refer clients to. At the ADM Crisis Center, we function as their “front door”, managing a waiting list and their admissions schedule. Average length of stay is between 60 to 90 days.



# RAMAR



RAMAR is the other Residential Treatment facility in Summit County. The difference between IBH and RAMAR is that RAMAR has an on-staff psychologist and is more capable of having medically inclined clients in their care. They have a full-time, round the clock nursing staff available to clients. This program also sustains Methadone/ Suboxone using clients. The average length of stay is between 60 to 90 days. We run their pre-certification list, a list of clients that have been given an assessment and have been recommended to their residential treatment facility.

# Access To Recovery

Access To Recovery (ATR) is a federal grant project that was awarded to several states this year. Starting January 1, 2011, clients will be able to benefit from these federal funds.

The ADM Crisis Center will have two caseworkers that will assist clients in obtaining the funds from this grant, so as to obtain sober housing, transportation, food assistance, and several other options in order for clients to “get back on their feet.”
